


anchor - a heavy metal hook attached to a ship and dropped over board to hold the ship in place

weary - tired; needing rest

rigging - all the ropes, chains, and pulleys used to control the masts and sails of ship



furl- to roll up and fasten

jack - a mechanical tool used to raise or move heavy objects, such as a car or house

swamps - areas of spongy, muddy land that are often filled with water



rough - built in a hurry; not completely finished
