


border- a part that forms the outside edge of something

threaded- passed thread through the eye of a needle

artificial - not real or natural; fake



babushka- (buh*BUSH*kah) a woman's head scarf; from the Russian word meaning "grandmother"



challah- a loaf of white bread, often braided, that traditionally is eaten at special Jewish celebrations



linen- cloth made from fibers of the flax plant



handkerchief - a square piece of cloth used for wiping the face or nose; a scarf



huppa- a canopy under which traditional Jewish weddings are performed



poverty- being very poor



bouquet- a bunch of flowers
