



pedestal- the base on which a statue stands




square- an open area in the center of town

scurried - move quickly


buona fortuna-(BWO-nuh for-TOO-nuh) Italian for good luck

strode - walked with long steps




minuscolo - (mee-NOO-sko-lo) Italian word for tiny
